4. Other-worldly shot of moon with clouds wafting around it.

5. Pan across hills to golden sun-ball.

6. Waves from opposite sides rolling in to meet each other.

FRESH WATERS

7. Misty, Japanese-print-like scene of heron by water.

8. Brilliant ball of sun, half-hidden behind grasses and clouds.

SFX: animal sounds piercing the night: mountain lion roar, great horned owl hooting, black bear growl

19. Profile shot of a heron in a tree.

SFX: Heron sqwark

20. Long follow shot of a heron flying.

21. Continue: a different flying shot.

22. The heron slows and gracefully lands.
