Final Script

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VIDEO #1 of 3: The Brazos and its Headwaters

FADE IN:

1. At a beautiful spot in a canyon where the Brazos is a tiny meandering stream, Duane Lucia walks along the water's edge.

SUPER: DUANE LUCIA Texas Parks and Wildlife

DUANE LUCIA: (on camera) "This is the Brazos River. Most people who live in the Lubbock area think of the Brazos as almost not a river at all ...

2. A close shot of the river that gives a sense of its sluggish flow.

DUANE LUCIA: (VOICE OVER)

"It <u>is</u> hard to imagine, looking here, that this would become a mighty river.

3. Another spot where the river trickles around a bend.

"Yet it's over 900 miles long ... and connects Lubbock to the Gulf of Mexico.

"Come along for a journey down the fascinating Brazos River."

dissolve to:

A SEQUENCE OF GORGEOUS SCENES OF THE BRAZOS IN DIFFERENT LOCALES, THAT SWIFTLY DISSOLVE ONE INTO THE OTHER. THE SCENES REVEAL THE RIVER AS IT WIDENS, AND THAT EXEMPLIFY ITS CHANGING ECOSYSTEMS

For example: 4. The narrow river winding through a caprock canyon.

MUSIC: Low-key music UP AND UNDER

NARRATOR: (VOICE OVER)

THE BRAZOS WATERSHED

ENCOMPASSES MORE THAN

40-THOUSAND SQUARE

MILES...

5. A wider river as it leaves Possum Kingdom Lake, bordered by steep cliffs.

... MORE AREA THAN ANY

OTHER TEXAS RIVER.

6. An even wider river coursing through flat prairie. SUPERIMPOSE: A map of Texas with the Brazos and its intricate web of waterways outlined in dark lines.

THOUSANDS OF WATERWAYS

FEED INTO IT:

TRIBUTARIES LIKE THE SALT

FORK ...

7. The broad river flowing through mesquite savanna. **Continue superimposed map.**

... CREEKS LIKE THE PALO

PINTO.

AND A MULTITUDE OF

RIVERS,

LIKE THE PALUXY, BOSQUE,

AND NAVASOTA.

8. The expansive river at the coastal estuary.

Continue superimposed map. The watershed web lines become faint and the map divides into three segments, each a different color. They're identified as: HEADWATERS, LAKES REGION, MAINSTEM AND ESTUARY

THE BRAZOS SNAKES ITS

WAY THROUGH THREE

DISTINCTLY DIFFERENT

REGIONS ...

... AND EPITOMIZES TEXAS

MORE THAN ANY OTHER

RIVER IN THE LONE STAR

STATE.

<u>MUSIC</u>: Segues to a more historic sound <u>UP AND UNDER</u>

9. The HEADWATERS section of the map moves forward and becomes full screen.

<u>dissolve through to</u>:

10. A beauty shot of the High Plains.

THE RIVER SOURCE

IS IN THE HIGH PLAINS ...

A SEQUENCE OF HISTORIC IMAGES FADE ON AND OFF OVER THE SCENE OF THE HIGH PLAINS For example:

11. <u>Superimpose:</u> Camera moves on an illustration of a group of Comanches on horseback.

... HOMELAND OF THE

COMANCHE AND KIOWA ...

12. <u>Superimpose:</u> Motion picture footage of close shots of buffalo grazing.

... AS THEY TRACKED

VAST HERDS OF BUFFALO

AND PRONGHORN.

13. <u>Superimpose:</u> Camera moves on an illustration from a Spanish expedition.

EVENTUALLY EXPLORERS,

BUFFALO HUNTERS AND

RANCHERS FOLLOWED.

MUSIC UP AND OUT

<u>SFX</u>: The exuberant trilling of thousands of sandhill cranes UP AND UNDER

dissolve to:

14. A scene, perhaps from the air, that shows two or three playas on the High Plains.

PLAYAS ARE THE MOST SIGNIFICANT FEATURE OF THE HIGH PLAINS ECOSYSTEM ...

15. A wide shot of a huge flock of sandhill cranes, perhaps at Mound Lake. Some are resting, some fluttering their wings in dance, some pecking or wading, others swooping in for a graceful landing.

... AND THE MOST

IMPORTANT REMAINING
