ADVENTURE AND GREAT UNDERTAKINGS: Herbert Hoover's Childhood at West Branch

1. EXTERIORS AND INTERIORS: THE BIRTHPLACE COTTAGE.

Beautiful images with a tender feeling portray the birthplace cottage, focusing on its treasures. Shots might include: The exterior of the house with sunlight streaming through the trees. The wavy window panes. The iron latches. The cradle. The trundle bed. The high chair. The sewing machine. The quilts. The whatnot. Possibly the house can be shot at night, with light from within to look like kerosene lantern light.
